PRESENT TENSE	OBJECTS	NOTES
I have no money.	cash	"I'm broke."
My friend has no money either.		"Can I <u>borrow</u> some money?" <i>(take)</i> "Can you <u>lend me</u> some money?" <i>(give me)</i> FRIEND: "I'm broke, too."
I need to get some money.		"I have to go to the bank."
I check my map.	map	"Where's the nearest bank?" <i>(where's = where is)</i>
There is a bank on Walnut (Street).	street	"What's the nearest cross street?" <i>(what's = what is)</i> <i>(cross = intersecting)</i>
I don't want to use the ATM. <i>(don't = do not)</i>	automatic teller machine	
I get in line.	line	"The line is really long!"
I wait for the next available teller.	clock	
A teller raises her hand.	signal	TELLER: "Next (customer), please!" "I can help you right here!"
The teller greets me.	greeting	TELLER: "Hi. What can I do for you today?"
I need to check my account balance.	checking account, savings account	CUSTOMER: "I'd like to check the balance in my checking account, please." <i>(I'd like = I would like)</i>
The teller tells me how much is in my account.	receipt	TELLER: (gives receipt) "You have 500 dollars in your checking account."
She asks if I need any more help.		TELLER: "Will there be anything else?"
I withdraw some money.	withdrawal (to take out)  deposit (to put in)	CUSTOMER: — " <u>I'd like</u> to make a withdrawal, please." <i>(formal)</i> — " <u>I'd like</u> to withdraw 100 dollars from my checking account, please." — " <u>I want</u> to make a withdrawal, please." <i>(informal)</i> — " <u>I'd like</u> to make a deposit, please." <i>(formal)</i> — " <u>I want</u> to make a deposit, please." <i>(informal)</i>
I tell her what I need.	denominations (units of money)	TELLER: "How would you like that (100 dollars)?" CUSTOMER: "I'd like twenties, please." <i>(formal)</i> "I'd like 4 twenties and 2 tens, please." <i>(formal)</i> "Could I have/get twenties, please?" <i>(less formal)</i> "Can I have/get twenties, please?" <i>(informal)</i> "I want/need twenties, please." <i>(informal)</i>
The teller asks me to sign.	electronic signature pad	TELLER: (points to pad) "Please sign here for your money."
The teller counts out my money and gives me a receipt.	receipt	TELLER: "20-40-60-80-100 dollars. Here's your receipt."
I leave the bank.	good-bye	TELLER: "Can I help you with anything else?" CUSTOMER: "No, thank you." TELLER: "Have a nice day!"
